## **Council and Board Objectives**

- Review 2020 recreational data gaps: all 3 species
- Review recent fishery performance, AP comments, and MC recommendation for scup 2021 recreational measures
- Adopt 2021 federal recreational measures for scup

## 2020 Recreational Data Gaps

- Typically, current year harvest projections are developed using MRIP wave 1-4 data (Jan-Aug)
  - Evaluated against next year's RHL to determine adjustments (if any) needed
- This year, recreational data gaps due to Covid-19 mean 2020 projections are not possible

## 2020 Recreational Data Gaps

- Access Point Angler Intercept Sampling (APAIS)
  data largely unavailable for waves 2-4 due to Covid
  restrictions
  - Wave 1 only generated for NC
- Effort data are available, but APAIS data needed for:
  - Harvest & discard rates
  - Weight/size of landed and discarded fish
  - Area fished (impacts estimated weights)
  - Target species


## 2020 Recreational Data Gaps

- MRIP is evaluating possible methods for generating 2020 catch estimates
  - e.g., Modeling, imputation, data proxies
- Unclear at this point what will be possible;
  will take time to develop
  - Any estimates for 2020 are not likely to be available until at least Spring 2021


## 2020 Effort Data

- Effort data (angler trips) available comparing waves 1-4 from 2018-2020
- Not species-specific
- Given lack of APAIS data, cannot be used to make inferences about 2020 harvest in weight or numbers of fish


## 2020 Effort Data: ME-NC

## **AP Comments**

- Fluke and BSB: Fishing effort appears to be down, particularly in for-hire sector
  - Potential for recruitment benefits due to less fishing pressure?
- Member of the public: current state of MRIP estimation for the rest of 2020? Has intercept sampling resumed?
  - Intercept sampling had partially or fully resumed in some states, but may be limited by factors such as higher interview refusal rates.
- Do we know how missing 2020 recreational angler intercept data would impact the assessments or assessment schedules?

## **MC Discussion**

- May not be feasible to generate wave/state specific estimates due to differential impacts on sampling and fishing effort by state and wave
  - Intercept sampling resumed at different points in the year in different states
  - Interviewers are getting fewer length and weight measurements during interviews
  - At sea sampling for headboats suspended

## **MC Discussion**

- MC agreed that additional data sources may provide additional context to or verification of the MRIP generated effort estimates but not informative for 2021 rec measures recommendations
  - e.g., license sales, bait and tackle sales, marina use
  - For-hire Vessel Trip Report (VTR) data of limited use due to small proportion of catch from for-hire mode and higher restrictions on fishery



- 2021 RHL: From 5.34 mil lb to 6.07 mil lb


## Scup Recreational Harvest 1981-2019





## **2019** Monitoring Committee

- Rec. harvest greater than previously thought
- Management response with allocation amendment
- Recommended status quo rec measures
- Avoid imposing additional restrictions on anglers for management issue
- SSB was 200% of the target in 2018

### Staff Recommendation for 2021

- Status quo recreational measures for scup in 2021
  - No 2020 prelim. harvest estimates to project harvest for the year
  - Changing bag, size, and season in 2021 would have highly uncertain outcomes
  - Availability may have declined in 2020 due to lower than average recruitment 2016-2018, limiting comparisons to 2019 estimates

## **AP Comments**

- 6 voiced support for status quo
  - High biomass, no 2020 rec harvest data
- No opposition
- One advisor noted MRIP estimates the number of trips and not the number of anglers
  - Private angler reporting would provide a better understanding of the number of anglers and what is being caught by rec. anglers

### MC Discussion and Recommendation

- No rec. harvest estimates in 2020
- No projections for 2021
- Same management situation as last year
  - GARFO staff noted that this remains a temporary solution and it is important to continue to make progress on the Commercial/Recreational Allocation Amendment
- Recommend status quo rec. measures in 2021

## **Council and Board Decision Point**

- Adopt 2021 recreational measures for scup
  - MC rec: status quo rec. measures in 2021:
    - 50 fish bag limit, min. size of 9 inches total length, open season from Jan 1 – December 31
