


#### **Overview**

- Since August of 2020, 1,995 tilefish landed (1,132 blueline tilefish, 783 golden tilefish and 107 tilefish spp. unknown).
- 3,074 private recreational tilefish permits issued to 1,564 vessels.
- 146 private recreational tilefish vessel trip reports (43 trips blueline and golden tilefish landed, 59 trips blueline tilefish and 37 trips golden tilefish landed).




# **Number of Blueline Tilefish Reported on Private Recreational VTRs (2020 – 2023)**







### **Number of Blueline Tilefish by a Vessel's Tilefish Permit Combination (2020 – 2023)**


# **Total Number of Golden Tilefish Reported** on Private Recreational VTRs (2020 – 2023)




# **Number of Vessels with Private Recreational Tilefish Permits (2020 – 2023)**


### **Number of Active Permits Reporting Private Recreational Tilefish**


### **Percentage of Active Permits Reporting Private Recreational Tilefish**


### **Average Number of Tilefish per Active Private Recreational Tilefish Permit**


# Number of Private Recreational Tilefish Trips by a Vessel's Tilefish Permit Combination (2020 – 2023)


### Mean number of Private Recreational Tilefish Trips by Month (2021 – 2022)


### **Number of Private Recreational Tilefish Trip by Private Recreational Tilefish Permit**




#### **Private Recreational Permit Denials**

- Four vessels (2 in 2022 and 2 in 2023) had their renewal application held up temporarily because they were in non-compliance with their commercial VTRs.
- GARFO requires that an applicant (both initial and renewal) provide certain information and to have a valid State Reg or USCG Documentation.
- GARFO does not track the number of applications that are not accepted because someone did not have a State Reg or Coast Guard Documentation.




Number of Private Recreational Tilefish Trips by a Vessel's Tilefish Permit Combination and Vendor ID (2020 – 2023)

#### **Software Issues**

- Emailed eFIN to inquire about software issues and status of 2023 private recreational tilefish trips.
- From eFIN, "We have not had any issues with the eFin software. Any updates needed are handled on our side and new releases can be pushed into the store when needed. It has been a stable app without any known issues. "There is no lag from when the user puts in the trip to submit it to when it is seen by GARFO".



### **Takeaways**

- Number of annual private recreational tilefish permits beginning to plateau in 2023.
- Trips reported per permit and number of active permits may have decreased in 2023.
- Could signal a decrease with rec anglers submitting their VTRs, but many other factors.



### **Takeaways**

- Private recreational VTRs provide information at the same scale (trip) we have commercial VTRs summarized (CAMS\_VTR\_REC/CFG\_VTR\_UOM).
- VTR reporting rates are unknown, so it is difficult to know the true total number of trips and number of tilefish landed.
- Estimating i) VTR reporting rates or ii) the number of landed tilefish using alternative methods (e.g., based on survey data) might provide more accurate estimates of the number of tilefish trips/number of landed tilefish.
- Alternative methods, could come with the tradeoff of losing trip level data.

### **Communication and Outreach**

- What we've been working on since October 2022:
  - Overhauled recreational tilefish permitting and reporting web page
  - Obtained contact information for tilefish and HMS permit holders for future targeted outreach efforts
  - Submitted a proposal to ACCSP with Harbor Light to conduct additional outreach efforts and add eFIN meta data collection improvements
  - Looking into hiring a contractor to develop new outreach materials and targeted HMS/Tilefish angler outreach
