
#### **Violation Summary**

**29SEP2**1: USCGC LAWSON issued a fisheries violation to a commercial fishing vessel for engaging in fishing without proper gear on-board in accordance with the master's federal fisheries permit.

#### **Marine Protected Species Support Summary**

**26AUG21:** Sector Delaware Bay received a report of an alive and stranded humpback whale on a sandbar in the vicinity of Cape Henlopen, DE. The Marine Mammal Stranding Center was contacted and Coast Guard launched a small boat to establish a safety zone around the whale. The stranded whale was able to free itself with rising tide, but then beached itself again on the sandbar and was unable to get free. NOAA determined further assistance was not possible and euthanized the whale.
