Re-Development of the Mid-Atlantic Research Set-Aside Program

Webinar Meeting Summary

June 2021

The Research Steering Committee (RSC) met via webinar on Wednesday, June 2, 2021 to discuss redevelopment of the Research Set-Aside (RSA) program. In doing so, the RSC discussed the outcomes of the March 2021 RSC meeting, the Scientific and Statistical Committee (SSC) Economic Working Group involvement, agendas/dates/locations/attendees for all 4 workshops and revisions to the workshop briefing materials. The Committee's recommendations from this meeting will be presented during the Committee reports at the June 2021 Council meeting.

Summary

The RSC confirmed the dates for the first 3 workshop webinars (research -7/15, funding -8/31, and enforcement -10/14) and noted the in-person workshop will be held in November with a TBD date and location. Additionally, the RSC identified an approach to notice the series of RSA Workshops to various invited participants/presenters, Council Advisory Panel members and members of the public.

The RSC worked to revise the draft workshop agendas and roles for all participants with multiple dedicated time slots for public comment. In doing so, the research subgroup of the SSC Economic Work Group (WG) identified a variety of topics they plan to present to promote discussion surrounding the economic impacts of redeveloping the RSA program. These topics all focus on the lessons learned since the inception of the RSA program in 2001. Additionally, the RSC offered suggestions to improve the trigger questions staff provided that will guide much of the structure for each workshop. Staff was directed to continue working with the RSC and Greater Atlantic Regional Fisheries Office (GARFO) to refine the briefing materials prior to the first webinar workshop.

The RSC confirmed a workshop structure for the July 15th webinar on research. The workshop will follow the structure outlined below and use the presented trigger questions to guide discussion:

- Welcome, introductions, goals and background (presentation)
- Presentation and discussion with the SSC Economic WG on research
- Presentation and discussion with a former RSA participant
- Trigger Question 1: How should research needs (to be fulfilled by RSA) be prioritized?
- Trigger Question 2: What criteria should be met to qualify as a successful applicant?
- Trigger Question 3: What criteria should be developed for how projects results will be reviewed and articulated to the Council?
- Wrap-up, summary, and recommendations

To ensure efficient progress and discussion occurs at each workshop, the RSC recommended that special consideration be given to the RSA framework document (<u>Framework 1 to the MAFMC FMPs</u>), which details the bounds of what can and cannot be changed through the potential redevelopment of the program. Staff will continue to work closely with GARFO to ensure developments of the revised RSA program consider the guidelines in Framework 1.
